

As most everyone knows I have had diabetic retinopathy for approximately 35 years. Ultimately in 1984 it left me functionally blind – unable to read, drive, or see much of anything. Through several surgeries I was gifted with restored, yet limited vision. The restored sight enabled me to drive, read and function adequately. Lately, because of age, the retinas aren't quite what they used to be. Reading is more difficult. Driving has become more dependent on my quality of vision any given hour of any given day, and often weather is a factor. Recently, during inclement weather, *imagine that!*, I had a Clergy Council Meeting. I looked out and realized my vision was good for driving. There have been other days I would have just not gone to the meeting because of poorer vision. I realized in that freeing moment that "life is truly a momentary existence". We must appreciate the present and its gifts.

Lent is about transformation. It is not so much about us making changes – giving something up, but rather allowing the changes of life to transform us into new

creatures. Richard Rohr says, "This is the real "try harder" that applies to Lent and its ultimate irony is that it is not a 'trying' at all, but an ultimate surrendering, dying and foundational letting go. You will not do it by yourself but it will be done unto you (Luke 1:38) by the events of your life."

My prayer is that this Lenten Season will be a transformational time for all of us and a time of revelation. It should not be so much about changes we make but rather a discovery, or rediscovery of what was always there and true, our Christ-selves.


