#### **MISSION UPDATE**

As has been mentioned before, it is an ongoing struggle to get involvement and participation of the congregation in the Church's Mission effort, via our Mission suggestion box at the back of the Church.

Our Mission suggestion box has seen very little use in the three years it has been there, only 2 suggestions in that time, from congregation. Mission gives to a spectrum of Charities, mostly national and international, and a few local charities too. These are reported every six months via congregational addresses and the annual report.

In light of this, it has been decided to reduce the number of Mission meetings from once /month, down to one /quarter. There is simply not the need to have everyone meet each month, when there are no suggestions and therefore no decisions to make on where to send our support.

Regular semi-automated donations will continue, as they always have, to the major charities we support. If in the future, interest and participation by congregation increases, then the Mission team will revisit the mission meeting frequency, and adjust as needed.


